- **Low vision and blindness are the leading causes of disability within the United States.**
- **More than 161 million people globally are visually impaired.**

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Helpful Low Vision Information

- **People who have low vision can live independent and fulfilling lives with assistance from low vision aids and devices.**
- **For people with low vision, using color contrast makes finding things easier, such as using a cutting board that is black on one side and white on the other.**
- **People who are blind or have low vision can enjoy movies and television with descriptive audio.**
- **An ever-increasing amount of people are at risk of developing a visual impairment as populations grow and demographic shifts move towards the predominance of older age groups. Protect and maximize your vision by seeing a doctor regularly.**
