Did you know?

- Low vision and blindness are the leading causes of disability within the United States. (Source: CDC)
- More than 161 million people globally are visually impaired.

Awareness tips:

- People who have low vision can live independent and fulfilling lives with assistance from low vision aids and devices. These devices and training can be found at your local Community Low Vision Center. Link: www.communitylowvision.org
 - For people with low vision, using color contrast makes finding things easier, such as using a cutting board that is black on one side and white on the other.
- People who are blind or low vision can enjoy movies and television with descriptive audio. If you would like to learn more about descriptive audio, ask your local Community Low Vision Center.

An ever-increasing amount of people are at risk of developing a visual impairment as populations grow and demographic shifts move towards the predominance of older age groups. Protect and maximize your vision by seeing a doctor regularly. Take advantage
