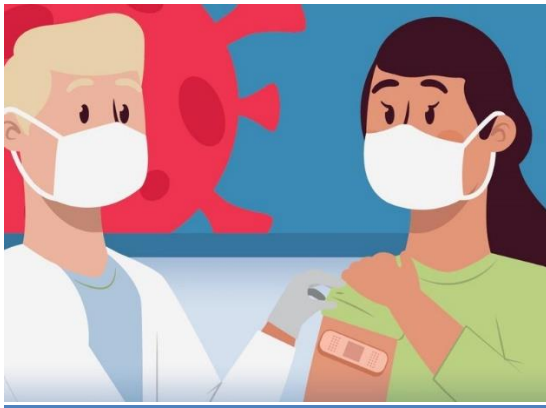

Covid Vaccination Mandate:

IFB Solutions is required to implement OSHA's COVID-19 vaccination rule, which applies to any employer with more than 100 employees. This means, all IFB employees have until Friday, February 4th to get the full vaccine regimen.

NEW: On Monday February 7th, IFB will begin to require weekly COVID-19 tests for those who aren't vaccinated. This includes those who have IFB approved religious or medical vaccine accommodations. Weekly testing is an OSHA requirement.

Next week, we will roll out plans for testing, training, and other critical information. You have 1 month to receive the full vaccine. After that, you will be required to test weekly. If you are vaccinated, you will not have to take a weekly test.

Unvaccinated employees who do not comply with OSHA's weekly testing requirement starting February 7th could be suspended without pay, or face other disciplinary action, up to and including termination.

Dates, policies, and procedures may change as the federal government, court systems and OSHA come together to figure out a plan that best serves our country. We appreciate your efforts to keep our staff safe as we work to comply with such requirements. More information to come.

Breakfast Choices: Our survey showed that most employees are happy with our breakfast options. For those looking for healthy or lighter options, you can choose from fresh fruit, yogurt, oatmeal, and cold cereal.

Lunch Choices: We hear your requests for more lunch options. Specifically, many of you asked for a culturally diverse menu and healthier sides. Mike will add carrot and celery sticks with ranch and mixed fruit or Mediterranean pasta in place of fries. Please enjoy the side salads as well.

Condiments: The survey revealed that many of you who are blind or visually impaired have a tough time finding condiments when they are moved around frequently. To make this easier for you, and COVID safe for everyone, Mike's staff will start handing out condiments at the register for those who purchase meals. If you bring your lunch, please remember to bring your own silverware and condiments, or you are welcome to purchase utensils and condiments at a reasonable price from the cashier. Napkins are available for everyone.

Communicating the Menu: We understand it is hard to hear the menu over the speakers. Almost everyone who took the survey wanted an easy-to-read menu that is accessible. Mike will work with the IFB communications team to publish the menu in different ways. *Due to supply chain issues, the menu could change at the last minute, but we will do our best to stick to the script! (We'll announce menu communications soon.)

Operating Hours: Many of you are looking for food options in the afternoon because of the new 4-day, 10-hour shifts. While Mike's café will not be able to serve hot food

during these times, we will install food vending machines with fresh options. This month, you'll be able to buy sandwiches and snacks with a credit card. The machines will also operate on Friday.

Hospitality: Respect and good service go hand in hand. Mike and IFB are dedicated to making changes that provide a healthy and enjoyable experience. We work with the Health Department to ensure our cafeteria is up to code, which includes food preparation and cleanliness. Our current rating is 98.0. We appreciate your feedback and hope you will enjoy our improvements.
