February is Low Vision Awareness Month

Did you know?

- There are 97,900 people with low vision in Arkansas and 285,500 in North Carolina. (Source: CDC)
- Visual impairment is unequally distributed across age groups.
 More than 82% of all people who are blind are 50 years of age and older.

Awareness tips:

 If you are sighted, please announce yourself when entering a room or even passing in the workplace. For example, "Hey Grant, it's Shonn". It helps those who are blind or have low vision feel comfortable.

- When in a group setting make sure to be clear to whom you are speaking to by using names. Example "Mike, what do you think of this idea?"
- Do your best to keep all walk paths clear of obstructions in the workplace. This will help people who are blind or have low vision travel safely.

An ever-increasing amount of people are at risk of developing a visual impairment as populations grow and demographic shifts move towards the predominance of older age groups. Protect and maximize your vision by seeing a doctor regularly. Take advantage of the Community Low Vision Center associates and experts in Winston-Salem, Asheville, and Little Rock. Insider Corner

<u>Tips for Instructing Virtual Meetings or Classes with Participants who are Low Vision or Blind:</u>

If you are sharing your screen in a zoom or teams meeting and there's individuals who are visually impaired or blind on the call, here are some tips to include their complete understanding of the material presented.

Handouts: If your presentation is shareable, email the document to the participants who are visually impaired so they have an opportunity to review or follow along as your presenting the information. Web page guidance: If your showing how to navigate a webpage, provide verbal directions of where the mouse pointer is moving towards and interacting with. Example: On the top right corner of the page click on the link with all capped red letters named, "Home".

Description: The more descriptive you are while navigating shared screen material the easier it is for everyone on the call to follow along. Identify any colors, icons, or page layouts to ensure even someone with vision who looked away for a minute is able to catch up successfully.

Magnification and Inverted Colors: If a participant utilizes these features remember when you share your screen, their personalized settings do not transfer to your shared screen. For example: if they use black and white inverted colors with some large print, when your screen appears on theirs it will not change to fit their settings, but will look like your screen instead. This creates an unusable display.

Asking Questions: The only way you will know how to help is to ask. Don't be afraid or feel as if you'll offend the person if you ask what type of assistance they need. Not only will this make your work easier in the long run, but it will gratefully improve their understanding of the material.

Why Participate in Sight Adjustment Support Group?

Sight Adjustment Support Group is designed to assist people dealing with vision loss. It doesn't matter if you lost your vision last week or years ago, your sight is classified low vision or totally blind, you utilize a cane or guide dog, or you read large print or braille, Sight Adjustment covers a variety of relatable topics helping you adjust to this new phase in your life. We want you to thrive in your life no matter what your vision is. Bryant Ballard and Angela Haynes are leaders of this group.

"By sharing our personal experiences, we learn from each other as sight adjustment differs from person to person. When you join this group, you have firsthand access to the information we put out monthly.
