### **COVID-19 Information:**

IFB Solutions has remove the mask mandate at our Winston-Salem, NC and Clemmons, NC facilities, coinciding with the City of Winston-Salem removing the city-wide mask mandate on March 1. No mask requirements are in place at our Asheville and Little Rock facilities.

IFB employees may still choose to wear masks and face shields while at work, and we ask that you respect the individual choices of those who continue. Visitors to IFB Solutions are not required to wear a mask.

Important notes:

- Per federal law, masks are still required on public transportation, including city buses and Trans Aid.
- Masks are required in IFB Solutions medical/nurse offices per CDC guidelines for medical facilities.
- Employees of the Community Low Vision Center and S.E.E. Programs will continue to mask when working with customers and participants.
- Community Low Vision Center customers and S.E.E. Program participants are strongly encouraged to wear a mask, and signage will reflect such at their entrances.

Talking Thermostat for Multiple Stage Systems | Price: \$209.95

This thermostat is designed to be the most user-friendly programmable thermostat on the market. Features include verbal step by step programming help, verbal announcement of temperature and settings, verbal dirty filter alert, and an oversized LCD display. This is the more advanced VIP3000 which operates on up to three stages of heating and two stages of cooling for both conventional and heat pump systems and can be set to automatically switch between heating and cooling – as determined by the thermostat temperature.

CLVC March item of the month:

Talking Food Cans: Easily Identify Food and Other Household Items | Price: \$25.95

- Record voice descriptions telling contents of cans
- Press button to hear message played back
- Reusable and re-recordable

The product comes in the form of a magnetic yellow cap that sits on top of any sized steel can. The cap allows you to record a short voice message, which can then be played back at any time with the touch of a button. It is very easy to use, and the voice messages can be rerecorded over and over making the product reusable time and time again.

# For the first time in two years, Social Security offices nationwide are set to open their doors.

The Social Security Administration is expected to reopen more than 1,200 field offices starting March 30 under an agreement reached this month with the unions representing workers for the agency. However, the exact date could still change since negotiations are ongoing and the situation with the pandemic continues to evolve.

Under the new agreement, all employees and visitors will be required to wear masks in Social Security offices, whether or not they are vaccinated.

"This agreement is only the first step, but we now have a path forward to begin reopening SSA offices and worksites in a manner that protects both the health and safety of employees and the public we serve," said Rich Couture, chief negotiator for the American Federation of Government Employees, one of three labor unions representing Social Security workers.
